



- **Where are campers staying?**

Campers will be sleeping in tents on the camp property (9182 S. 300 W, Pendleton) Group size will vary, but each group will have tents provided for all the campers in their group. The group leaders will have an adjacent tent and will stay with their group the entire time and all group leaders have a background check on file.

- **Do they need to bring any special equipment/clothing?**

Everything campers will need to bring will be listed on the "Event Packet". This packet will be e-mailed to you near the event and also will be available on the Adventure Camp page. (www.pendcc.org/adventurecamp)

- **What should they NOT bring?**

Also listed in the "Event Packet" will be any items students should not bring.

- **Are scholarships available to cover the cost?**

- **Can my child be in the same group as their friend?**

Yes. In fact, the registration asks for you to list two of your child's friends. We want all campers to be excited about hanging out with their friends and growing with God over the weekend.

- **My child takes morning/evening meds. Who will administer these?**

At our summer event we have dedicated medical staff who will make sure your child takes the appropriate medication at the appropriate times.

- **Can my child's special diet be accommodated?**

- **Is Summer Camp only for Pendleton students? Can a friend from another school district apply?**

Winter Weekend is open to any student grades 6th-12th, no matter the school district.

- **My child would love to come but we have conflicts on our calendar. Would we be able to leave and come back?**

This is one of the questions we get asked every year. We believe that part of what makes camp special is that campers and adults get away from all the other distractions. We highly encourage you to make sure you communicate to your child that their faith is a top priority. Sports are great. Other opportunities are great. But Adventure Camp is the best four days of the Summer. There's nothing like it, so we recommend clearing your calendar so that your child gets the most out of this experience.
